THE VALUE OF CASA IN MY COURTROOM

The Court Appointed Special Advocate (CASA) is an integral partner in the judiciary's efforts to improve the lives of children, keep them with their parents if it is safe, reunite families when appropriate, and ultimately establish permanency for the children.

Family Court judges need and regularly rely upon the information provided by CASA volunteers because it is generally not readily available from or provided by other sources. This information is essential when the Court is tasked with making significant decisions that affect the children and their family.

CASA volunteers often meet and talk with teachers, school counselors, daycare providers and therapists. The volunteers provide information regarding doctor visits and dental care, and whether the children are up to date with appointments and therapy.

The CASA volunteers also talk with parents, relatives, foster parents and other people who have important relationships with the children.

Most importantly, the volunteers serve as an additional voice for children who often feel scared, worried, uninformed and displaced. Many are children of trauma who feel their wishes and desires ao unheard in the court system.

In each case, judges need as many eves and as much information on the family as possible to ensure that appropriate decisions are made and that their decisions are always in the best interest of children.

CASA fundraises 100% of its budget through grants (63%), special events (13%), and individual/organizational donations (24%).

Last year, CASA served 627 vulnerable children (the most in the agency's 35 year history). Despite this, there were 150 children waiting for a CASA. It costs an average of \$1,000 to recruit, train and pair a volunteer with one case for one year.

CASA invites companies, foundations and individuals to consider becoming a CASA Investor through its Impact Giving Program. The program allows donors to give a specific yearly donation that would support both programming and special events, thus increasing CASA's awareness and impact in the community.
