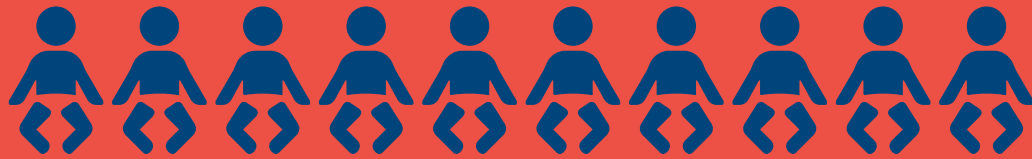

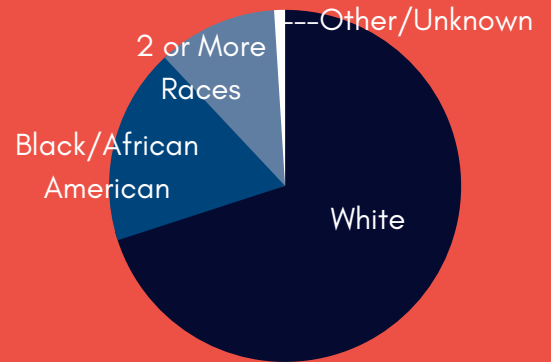

REASONS FOR REMOVAL

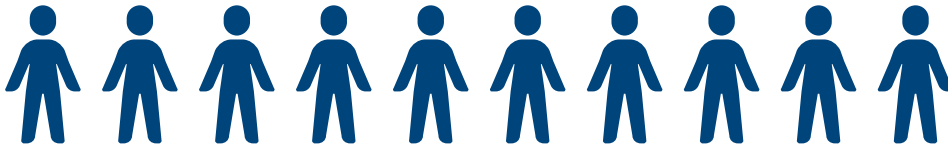


# VOLUNTEERS

CASA reached 74% of target.



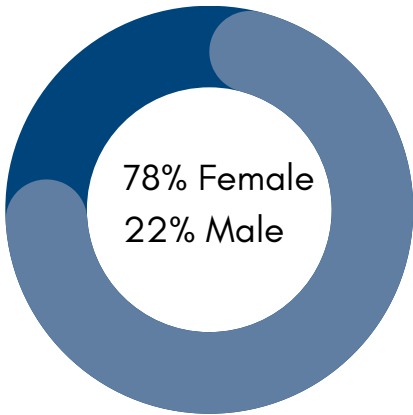
210 VOLUNTEERS PAIRED WITH A CASE

Age 21-39



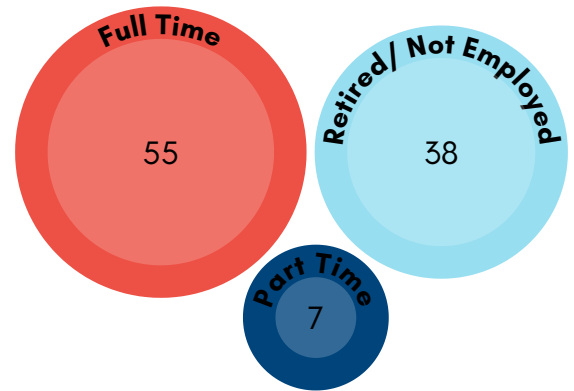
Age 40-59

## % Volunteers by Work Status





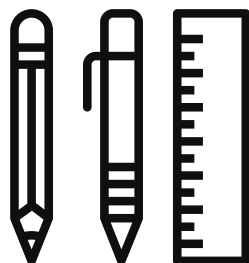
# OUR IMPACT

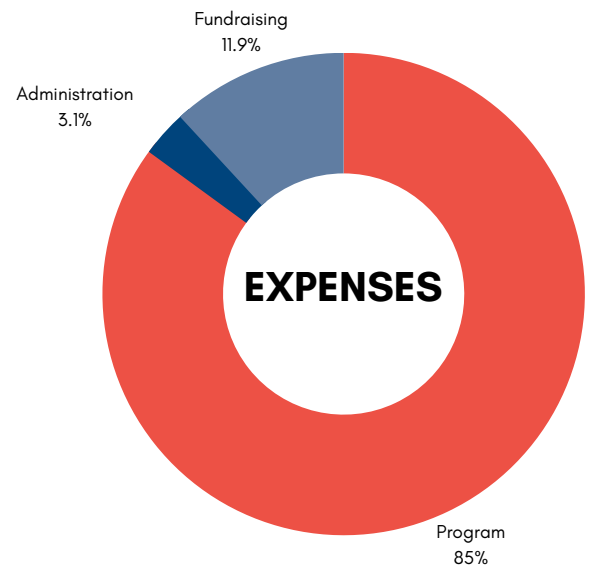
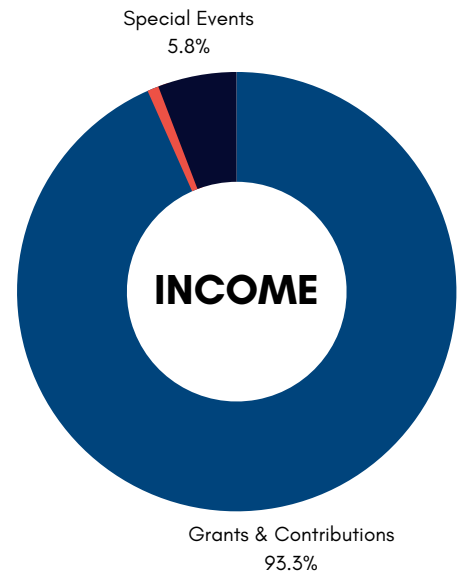
